

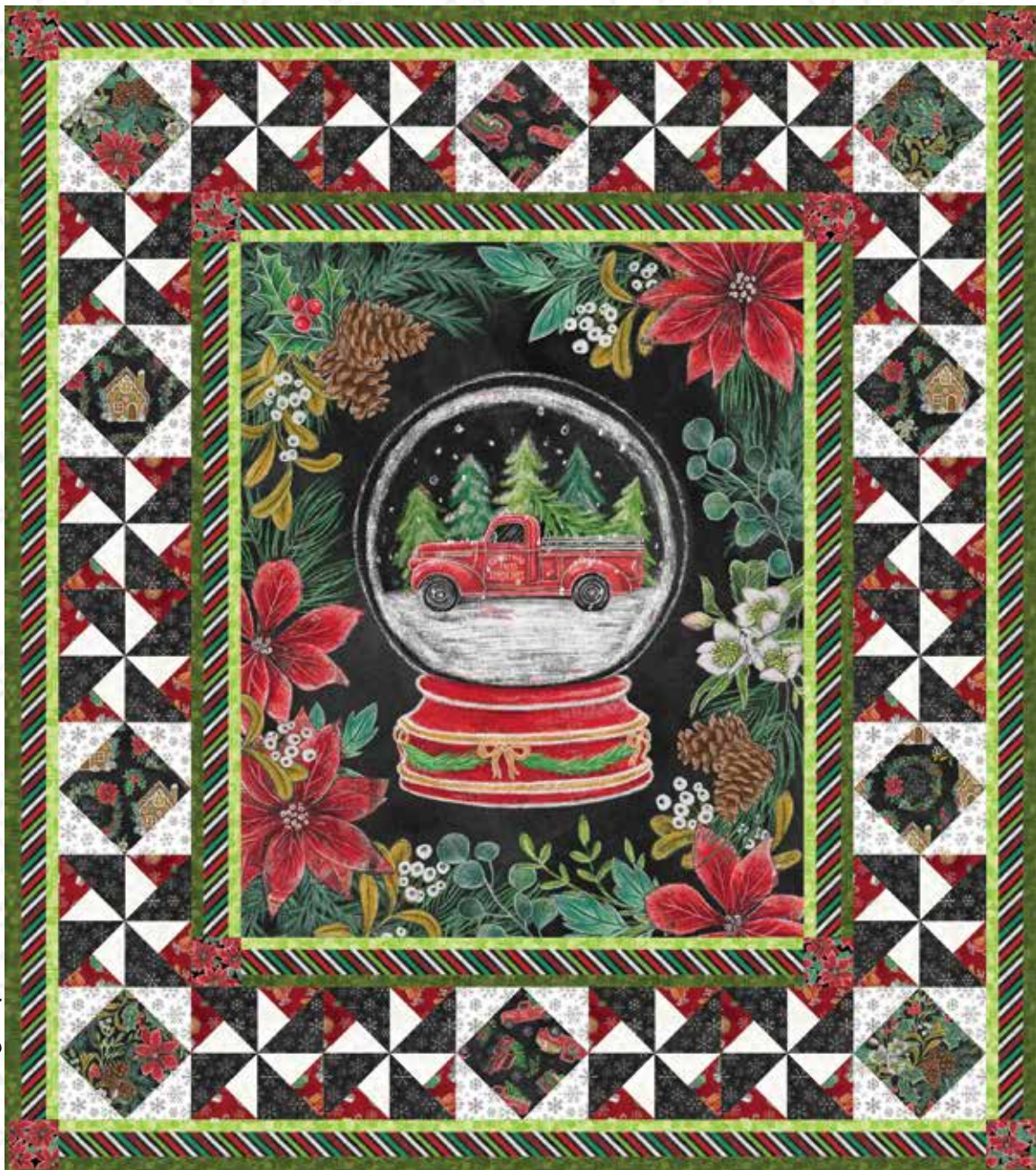

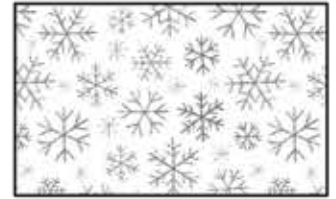

$\frac{3}{4}$ yard	Biased Stripe - Black/Multi (C)	2218-99
1 $\frac{1}{8}$ yards	Jot Dot - Olive (D)	9570-65*
$\frac{1}{3}$ yard	Christmas Greenery & Poinsettias - Green (E)	2216-66
$\frac{3}{4}$ yard	Snowflake - White (F)	2219-01
$\frac{1}{2}$ yard	Jot Dot - Marshmallow (G)	9570-09
$\frac{1}{2}$ yard	Christmas Treats & Sweets - Red (H)	2222-88
$\frac{2}{3}$ yard	Snowflake - Black (I)	2219-99
$\frac{1}{3}$ yard	Tossed Red Trucks - Black (J)	2220-99
$\frac{1}{3}$ yard	Gingerbread Houses & Christmas Wreaths - Black (K)	2223-99
$\frac{1}{4}$ yard	Poinsettias - Red (L)	2217-88

### Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

#### From the Christmas Snowglobe Panel - 36 inches - Black (A):

- (1) 34  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42  $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle, centered on the panel.

#### From the Jot Dot - Chartreuse (B), cut:

- (2) 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 42  $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (2) 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 34  $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips.
- (4) 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 64  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (3) 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 56  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

#### From the Biased Stripe - Black/Multi (C), cut:

- (2) 2" x 42  $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (2) 2" x 34  $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 64  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 56  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

#### From the Jot Dot - Olive (D), cut:

- (2) 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 42  $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (2) 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 34  $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips.
- (4) 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 64  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (3) 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 56  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (7) 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Christmas Greenery & Poinsettias - Green (E), cut:

- (1) 8  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 8  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

#### From the Snowflake - White (F), cut:

- (5) 4  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 4  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

#### From the Jot Dot - Marshmallow (G), cut:

- (2) 5  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 5  $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (64) 5  $\frac{1}{4}$ " triangles.

#### From the Christmas Treats & Sweets - Red (H), cut:

- (2) 5  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 5  $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (64) 5  $\frac{1}{4}$ " triangles.

#### From the Snowflake - Black (I), cut:

- (4) 4  $\frac{7}{8}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 4  $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (64) 4  $\frac{7}{8}$ " triangles.

#### From the Tossed Red Trucks - Black (J), cut:

- (1) 8  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 8  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

#### From the Gingerbread Houses & Christmas Wreaths - Black (K), cut:

- (1) 8  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 8  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

#### From the Poinsettias - Red (L), cut:

- (1) 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

#### From the Poinsettias - Red (Backing), cut:

- (2) 78" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 70" x 78" back.

### Block Assembly

*Note: The arrows figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.*

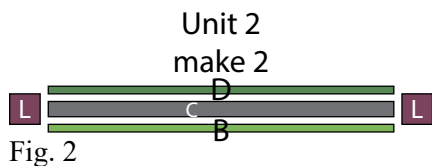
1. Sew (1) 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 42  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip, (1) 2" x 42  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip and (1) 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 42  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip together lengthwise and in that order from left to right to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 1). Repeat to make a second Unit 1 strip.

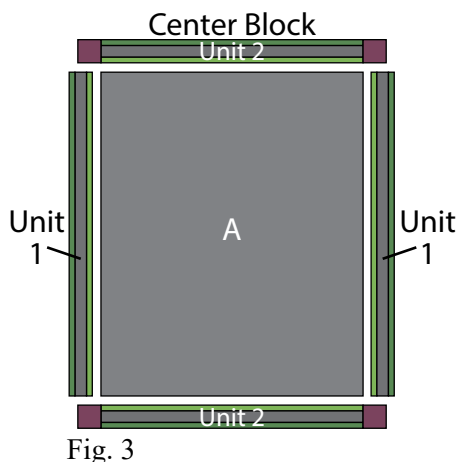

2. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $34\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip, (1)  $2$ " x  $34\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip and (1)  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $34\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip together lengthwise and in that order from top to bottom. Sew (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric L square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Fig. 2). Repeat to make a second Unit 2 strip.



3. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of the  $34\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $42\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the  $40\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $48\frac{1}{2}$ " Center Block (Fig. 3).



4. Place (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square on the top left corner of (1)  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric K square, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 5).

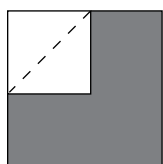

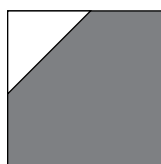

5. Follow Figure 6 for the seam direction to add a  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square to each of the remaining corners of the  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric K square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 7).

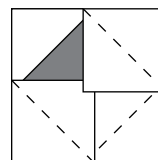

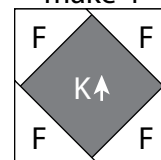

7. Repeat Steps 4-5 and refer to Figures 8-9 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (4) Block Two squares and (2) Block Three squares.

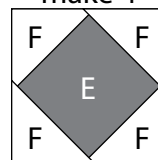

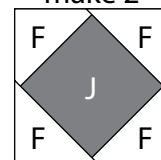

8. Sew (1)  $5\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric H triangle and (1)  $5\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric G triangle together along short sides. Sew (1)  $4\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric I triangle to the long side of the newly sewn triangle to make (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 3 square (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (64) Unit 3 squares total.

9. Sew (4) Unit 3 squares together into a  $2 \times 2$  matrix to make (1)  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Four square (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (16) Block Four squares total.

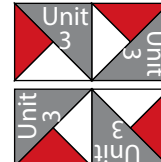

## Page 3

10. Sew together (1) Block Four square, (1) Block One square, (2) Block Four squares, (1) Block One square and (1) Block Four square, in that order from top to bottom, to make (1) Inner Side Border (Fig. 12). Repeat to make a second Inner Side Border.

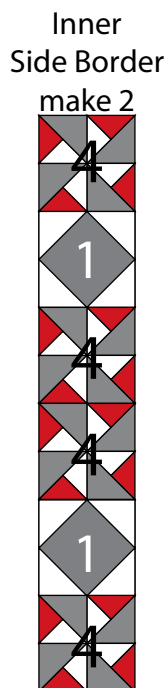

11. Sew together (1) Block Two square, (2) Block Four squares, (1) Block Three square, (2) Block Four squares and (1) Block Two square, in that order from left to right, to make the Inner Top Border (Fig. 13). Repeat to make the Inner Bottom Border.

12. Sew together (1)  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $64\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip, (1) 2" x  $64\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip and (1)  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $64\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip, lengthwise and in that order from left to right, to make (1) Outer Side Border (Fig. 14). Repeat to make a second Outer Side Border.

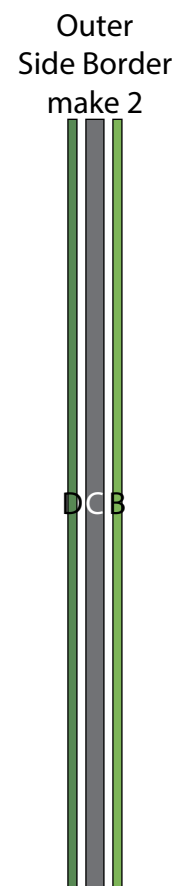

13. Sew together (1)  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $56\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip, (1) 2" x  $56\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip and (1)  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $56\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip, lengthwise and in that order from top to bottom. Sew (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric L square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Outer Top Border (Fig. 15). Repeat to make the Outer Bottom Border.

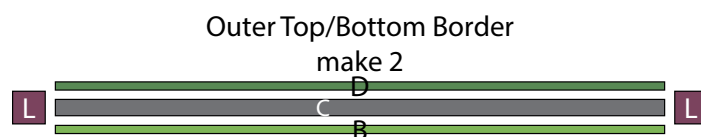

### Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

14. Sew (1) Inner Side Border to each side of the Center Block.

15. Sew the Inner Top Border and Inner Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

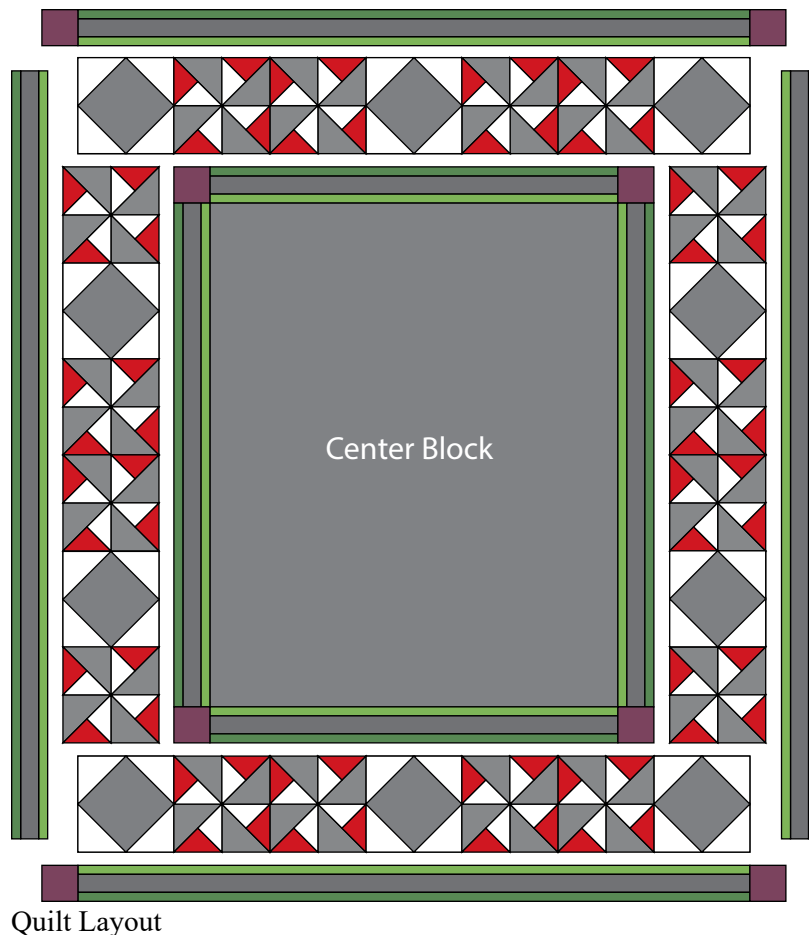
16. Sew (1) Outer Side Border to each side of the Center Block.

17. Sew the Outer Top Border and Outer Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

18. Layer and quilt as desired.

19. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric D strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

20. Bind as desired.
